It has been reassuring to have higher attendance rates over the past four weeks, as we focus on a term that is critically important in the year's cycle of teaching and learning. While the impact of COVID has reduced this term, it is evident in our school community. That, and the usual winter illnesses, means that we are still experiencing some pressure from staff and student absences. Thank you for remaining watchful of your son's health, and for communicating with us if he is absent. #### **PINK SHIRT DAY**

We recently acknowledged Pink Shirt Day which highlights the antibullying message. The day has grown from highlighting anti-homophobic bullying to a much wider antibullying message. We encouraged staff and students to wear pink and held a non-uniform day, which raised funds for the Mental Health Foundation.
