Winter sport is now underway for hundreds of our boys. All our teams, including premier grades, are playing grading games or have already started their season campaigns.

#### **CROSS COUNTRY**

Well done to everyone who competed in the college's annual Cross Country event. The top three juniors were HUGO CAMPION (1st), SEB CAMPION (2nd) and OSCAR POLITINI (3rd). In the seniors, our top three finishers were DESMOND REDDY (1st), SAM JONES (2nd) and MANAWA MITCALFE MATTHEWS (3rd).

Recently 20 students competed in the College Sport Wellington Cross Country Relays held at Wakefield Park in Island Bay. For many students this was their first competition representing the college.

The senior boys started the day with a good run from **DESMOND REDDY** on the first lap. He finished with the second fastest time overall on the day, with the senior team finishing 6th in Wellington.

The 1st XV play against Tawa College at Rongotai in its first Premier fixture of the season on Saturday. Last week they came away with a solid 36 - 12 win over Taita College, their last in grading game.

Our premier teams will be focused on their weekend fixtures, but will also have in the back of their minds the Annual Winter Traditional against Wellington College on Wednesday 5 June at Rongotai College.
