We are now half way through Term 3, and entering a very busy period of assessments for senior students, including Year 12 and 13 examinations plus CAA Literacy and Numeracy examinations.

SENIOR EXAMINATIONS

Due to the changes to NCEA Level 1, we have decided that Year 11 exams will now take place in Weeks 1 and 2 of Term 4 (18-22 October). Year 12 and 13 exams will still take place at the previously advised time of 16 to 19 September.

For your information, the examination timetable is included with this newsletter for the Year 12 and 13 exams.

These exams are an important signpost of your son's current progress towards NCEA. Your son may tell you that he does not have to revise for these examinations because they are unimportant and don't mean anything. Don't believe him - these examinations are very important and they are compulsory! The main purpose of the examinations is to assess your son's current progress towards NCEA (highlighting strengths and areas of concern) and to give him a practice run at externally assessed Achievement Standards. Please assist your son with his study and revision programme.

For some boys there may be a health issue, family or other circumstance that prevents him from sitting the external examinations in November. These school examinations provide us with evidence to support your son with any consideration he may need for a **derived grade** later in the year.

Also included as part of our examinations are some external assessments. The Level 1 CAA Maths and English exams will be held from 10-13 September. This is for those students who did not pass the CAA exams held in May and also selected Year 9 and 10 students.

Your son will have been told if he is sitting the CAA exams. You should

Last week was Subject Selection Week, when students record the course they wish to study in 2025. This was completed by your son online; you will receive a confirmation of his choices by email at some time over the next few weeks, for you to discuss with him.

It is extremely important that your son has made the correct decisions, as we base our classes in subjects for next year on the numbers signalled by this process. Once the timetable is generated, it is difficult to make changes, for instance adding classes.
