STUDENT CELLPHONE USE

In line with the Ministry of Education policy, student access to cell phones is not allowed during the school day. This was adopted by our Board in November 2023, prior to the Ministry advice, but with the knowledge it would be introduced by the government in 2024.

This policy will work in the following ways:

• Cell phones and accessories related to cell phones (i.e. headphones and Air Pods) must not be used or be visible on college grounds during the hours of 8.50am and 3.15pm (including morning and afternoon breaks). They may be stored in bags, lockers, or in pockets, but must not be used or visible and should be turned off or switched to Flight Mode. We would encourage students to leave their phones in their locker or bag to remove the distraction of notifications.

- If cell phones or accessories attached are visible or being used the following consequences will be applied:
 a. First Instance: confiscated for the remainder of the school day.
 - b. Second Instance: confiscated for the remainder of the school day, and the student will be required to sign the phone in and out of the Deputy Principal office at 8.50am and 3.20pm respectively, for a period of one week.
 - c. Further violations will involve the Deputy Principal communicating with home to establish a strategy with the family.
- Cell phones taken from students will be given back at 3.20pm from the Deputy Principal's Office. Phones will generally not be held overnight by the school unless a student does not return to pick it up.
- Air Pods and headphones will not be allowed during school hours unless connected to a Chromebook in class time (but only with permission of the teacher).



If you need to contact your son during school hours you can call the school office and a message will be sent to his class. Students will also have access to their school email address via Chromebooks or laptops throughout the school day. If your son needs to urgently contact you during the school day, he may go to the front office and use the landline.

TEACHER PROFESSIONAL LEARNING - THURSDAYS

To provide time for staff professional learning, lessons will be starting slightly later on **Thursdays**. Instead of 8.55am, school will start at 9.15am.

No form time will be held on this day so only five minutes of class time will be lost to allow for this professional development. The school day will finish at the normal time and buses will run as usual. The school will be open at the same time, of course, meaning that your son will simply have 20 minutes to fill in before classes start if he comes by bus. Students who do not arrive by bus must be at school by

9.15am. This will start from **Thursday 13 February**.

WEEKLY REPORTING

From Week 3 we will be providing a weekly overview of your son's work at school. Teachers will provide a grade from 1 (poor) – 5 (well above expectations), outlining how your son has worked in class over the previous five days. Descriptors can be found on the school's website.

These will be emailed to parents on Friday afternoon each week. If your son has been absent during the week, he will not receive a grade. At the end of term, you will receive a report with the average for the term.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP 2025

Prefects were announced at Senior Prizegiving last year. At assembly today, we acknowledged our student leaders for 2025 and presented them with their badges. Prefects give leadership and provide support to other students in the school. Our prefects have an important role and may well instruct your son to follow proper rules and do the right thing when this is not happening. We believe with this style of reporting, you should have a better understanding of how your son is working throughout the term, weekby-week, and you will be able to see if his level of performance in class has dropped or has improved.

YEAR 9 PARENTS' EVENING

All parents / caregivers of Year 9 students are invited to the college on the evening of **Wednesday 19 February**. This evening is held to give you the opportunity to understand our college's structures and systems so that you can best assist your son in his learning. You will also be able to meet your son's core subject teachers. The evening will begin at 6pm in the college's Renner Hall.

NCEA INFORMATION EVENING

Parents often ask questions regarding how NCEA operates. I think it is vital that you understand NCEA and what is needed for your son to succeed. To ensure that you are informed, Mr Reddy (Deputy Principal) will be hosting an NCEA Information Evening for parents on **Tuesday 11 March** in the college's Library at 6pm.

It is important that whānau of Year 11, 12 and 13 students who wish to gain a better understanding of NCEA attend particularly given that Level 1 of NCEA has changed; parents of students in Year 10 are also most welcome.

BYOD

Rongotai College continues to strongly encourage students to bring their own digital device to school for learning purposes. In 2025, we are again focusing our teaching on using devices, and any student at any level may bring a device to enhance their learning.



While we have not specified a device that your son must use, we recommend that Year 9-11 students have a **chromebook**.

I know security is an important issue for parents. Students are responsible for the security of their devices. They are able to rent lockers from the College Shop for \$20 if they wish.

While the school has a number of devices available for students to use, we cannot provide a device for every boy. Over the past few years, a growing number of boys have made the relatively selfish decision not to bring their devices to school even though they have them. This reduces our capacity to help boys who do not have devices. If you have a device for your son, please ensure he brings it to school.

Establishing and maintaining good communication between parents and the college is essential for your son's learning. - If your son is coming by bus, he should ask his bus driver to drop him as near to Newtown Park as he can. Students will be dismissed from Newtown Park at the conclusion of the day (approximately 2.30pm) and are required to make their own way home.
- Please make sure that your son dresses appropriately for the weather and provide him with sun block and a hat.
- Students are encouraged to wear clothing in their house colours but may NOT wear bandanas. No face paint is permitted.

Wednesday 13 February will be the finals day for those students who have qualified. This finals event will be held in conjunction with Wellington College, at Newtown Park.

Parents are, of course, most welcome to attend our Athletic Days. We are looking forward to these enjoyable days.
