This is an intensive English course aimed at students who need further assistance to prepare for the literacy assessment (CAA). The focus will be learning and application of academic English. The course will teach writing across different genres for different purposes and audiences. Students will learn to utilise appropriate language features and structures that enhance texts. They will develop critical awareness and will also learn to identify ideas within texts. They have the opportunity to gain Level 1 English Language Learning credits and there is a large proportion of the work that is portfolio based. Marks for the portfolio element of the course will be given in Term 4.
